9th June marks the World Accreditation Day every year. World Accreditation Day, a global initiative jointly established by IAF and ILAC to promote the value of accreditation, has been held every year on June 9, since 2008. The International Accreditation Forum (IAF) and International Laboratory Accreditation Cooperation (ILAC) have announced that the theme of World Accreditation Day 2018 will be how accreditation delivers a safer world. Hundreds of IAF and ILAC members will celebrate world accreditation day by organizing a series of commemorative activities including major national events, seminars, and media events, to communicate the value of accreditation. NABL, NABCB and NABET (constituent Boards of Quality Council of India) are celebrating the World Accreditation Day on 9 June 2018 at New Delhi, Kolkata, Bangalore and Pune with the following key deliberations:

- Health Safety through Pharmaceutical testing
- Food safety linkage with Accreditation
- Legal Metrology in Social Life
- Safety through Certification Bodies
- Construction Materials through testing



The role of Government and Regulatory bodies is to ensure that businesses provide a safe working environment. They set policy or technical requirements for products or services that are placed in the market, and rely on accredited conformity assessment bodies to verify compliance with those requirements. Accreditation can be used to support health and safety policy in different ways.

The products and services tested, inspected or certified once under the IAF and ILAC umbrella, can be accepted everywhere with equal confidence.
