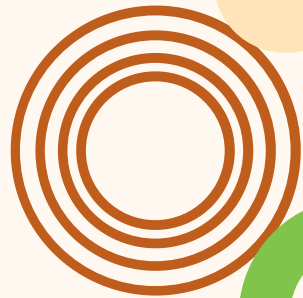

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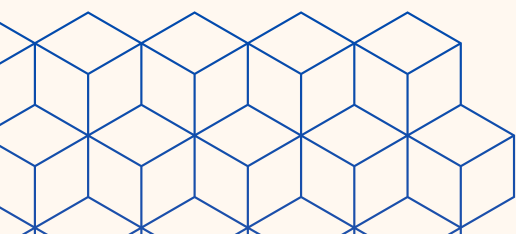
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ABOUT NABCB

The **National Accreditation Board for Certification Bodies (NABCB)**, a constituent Board of the Quality Council of India (QCI), plays a central role in strengthening India's quality infrastructure by ensuring that conformity assessment bodies operate with competence, impartiality, and global credibility. NABCB provides accreditation to certification bodies, inspection bodies, and validation & verification bodies, evaluating them through a rigorous process based on internationally accepted standards and guidelines. These assessments include documentation review, on-site assessments, and ongoing surveillance to ensure Independence and Reliability.

NABCB's work directly contributes to enhancing trust in certified products, processes, and services, supporting regulators, industries, and consumers across various sectors. Its accreditation programs align with global best practices, enabling accredited bodies to demonstrate consistent performance and technical competence in the services they deliver.

Global Recognition Through MLAs/MRAs

NABCB is a signatory to multiple Multilateral and Mutual Recognition Arrangements under IAF, ILAC, and APAC. These agreements:

GUIDANCE TO USE NABCB ACCREDITATION SYMBOL AND ILAC MRA MARK/ IAF MLA MARK

BCB 202, Feb 2023 Specifies the Conditions for Use of NABCB Accreditation Symbol and Other Claims of Accreditation, IAF MLA Mark and ILAC MRA Mark

The NABCB Accreditation Symbol represents credibility, competence, and international alignment. It comprises the NABCB symbol along with the unique accreditation number assigned to each accredited Conformity Assessment Body (CAB). The approved design specifications, including proportions, colour schemes, and usage format, are detailed in Appendix A (NABCB Symbol) and Appendix B (combined NABCB–IAF MLA / ILAC MRA Mark).

Accredited CABs, where permitted, may also use the Combined IAF MLA Mark (for certification and validation/verification bodies) or the ILAC MRA Mark (for inspection bodies). Use of these international marks shall comply with IAF ML 2 and ILAC R7 requirements and is subject to a formal agreement with NABCB, ensuring correct representation and alignment with international accreditation frameworks.

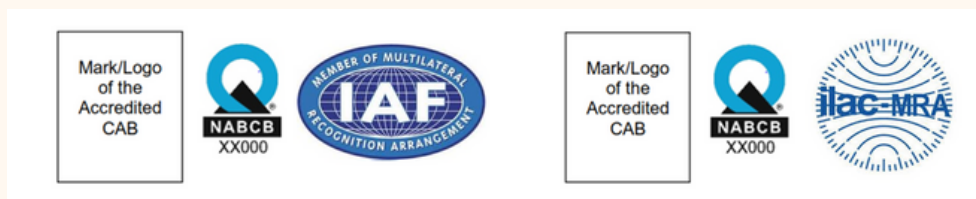

Control and Responsibility

ASPECT	REQUIREMENT
Responsibility	The NABCB-accredited Conformity Assessment Body (CAB) is fully responsible for the correct and authorized use of the NABCB Accreditation Symbol.
Control of Client Use	Any permitted use of the NABCB Accreditation Symbol by client organizations shall be allowed only under the control and supervision of the NABCB-accredited CAB.

ASPECT	REQUIREMENT
Scope Limitation	The NABCB Accreditation Symbol shall be used only for accredited scopes and locations covered under the CAB's accreditation.
Prevention of Misuse	The accredited CAB shall take reasonable actions to prevent misleading, incorrect, or unauthorized use of the NABCB Accreditation Symbol by itself or its client organizations.
Corrective Action	In case of misuse, the accredited CAB shall ensure immediate corrective action, including withdrawal of authorization where required.
Non-Compliance	Failure to control or prevent misuse of the NABCB Accreditation Symbol may result in corrective action, suspension, or withdrawal of accreditation.

The accredited CAB can reproduce the NABCB Accreditation Symbol and the Combined IAF MLA or ILAC MRA Mark as applicable only in conjunction with its own logo / mark on its certificates, reports, stationery and literature associated with its accredited activities and scopes subject to the conditions specified in BCB-202.

Prohibited Use of NABCB Accreditation Symbol

AREA / MEDIUM	RESTRICTION
Products and Product Packaging	The NABCB Accreditation Symbol shall not be used on products, product packaging, labels, or any material that may imply product approval.
Management Systems Certification	The NABCB Accreditation Symbol shall not be used in any manner that suggests certification or approval of a product, process, or service.
Vehicles	The NABCB Accreditation Symbol shall not be displayed on vehicles, except as part of a large publicity advertisement.
Buildings and Flags	The NABCB Accreditation Symbol shall not be displayed on buildings or flags under any circumstances.
Visiting Cards	Use of the NABCB Accreditation Symbol on visiting cards is not permitted.
Misleading Representation	The NABCB Accreditation Symbol shall not be used in any way that misleads the reader about the accredited status of the CAB or its client organization.

Use of IAF MLA/ILAC MRA Mark

MARK	PERMITTED USE CONDITIONS
IAF MLA Mark	The IAF MLA Mark may be used only by NABCB-accredited Certification Bodies and Validation/Verification Bodies, in combination with the NABCB Accreditation Symbol, and strictly in accordance with the terms of the agreement signed with NABCB.

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ILAC MRA Mark	The ILAC MRA Mark may be used only by NABCB-accredited Inspection Bodies, in combination with the NABCB Accreditation Symbol, and strictly in accordance with the agreement signed with NABCB.
Use by Client Organizations	Client organizations of NABCB-accredited CABs shall not use the IAF MLA Mark or the ILAC MRA Mark under any circumstances.

Product vs Management System Certification

CERTIFICATION TYPE	SYMBOL USAGE RULE
Management Systems Certification	Neither the Certification Body's Symbol nor the Accreditation Body's Symbol shall be used on products, packaging, or labels.
Product Certification	The Certification Body may authorize use of its own product conformity mark. Use of the NABCB Accreditation Symbol on products is not permitted.



Use of the NABCB Accreditation Symbol on products or product packaging is NOT permitted.



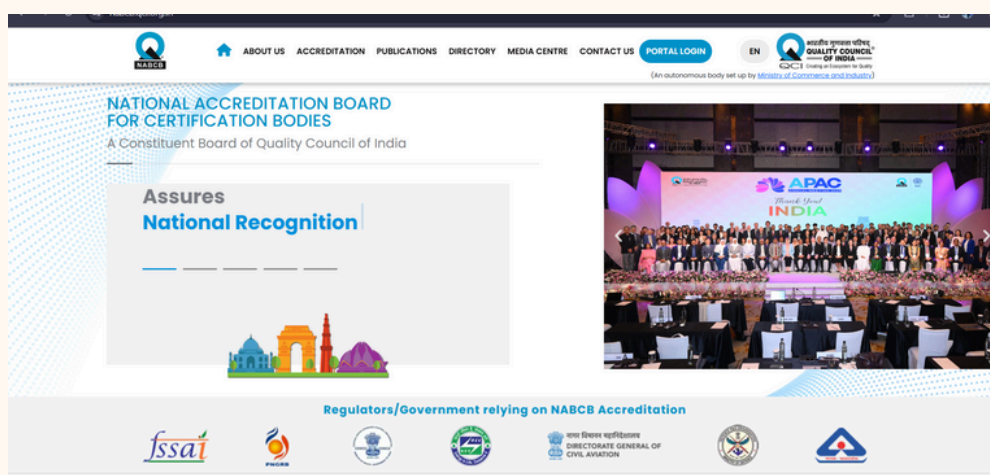
Use of NABCB Accreditation Symbol, IAF MLA Mark, or ILAC MRA Mark on visiting cards is NOT permitted.

Action on Suspension or Withdrawal

Upon suspension or withdrawal of accreditation, the accredited CAB shall immediately discontinue the use of the NABCB Accreditation Symbol, IAF MLA Mark, and ILAC MRA Mark on all certificates, stationery, and publicity material. Use may resume only after suspension is formally revoked.

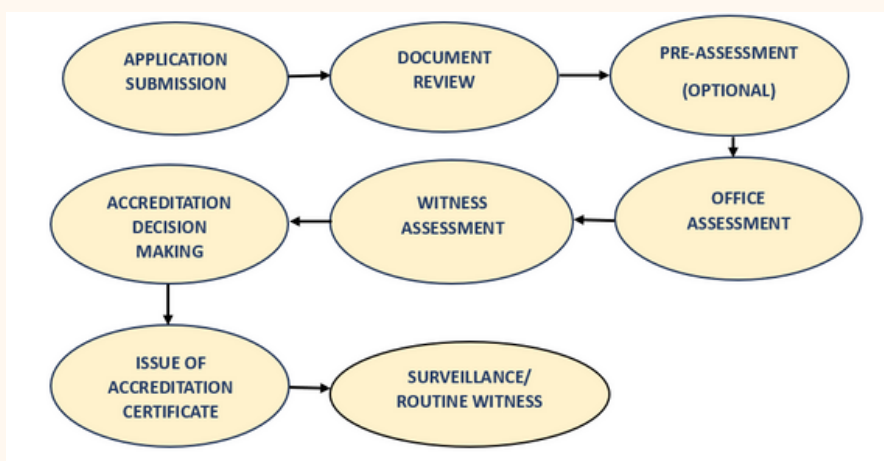

The sequence of activities—from application to accreditation decision—ensures that each CAB is rigorously assessed before approval and continuously monitored throughout the Accreditation cycle.



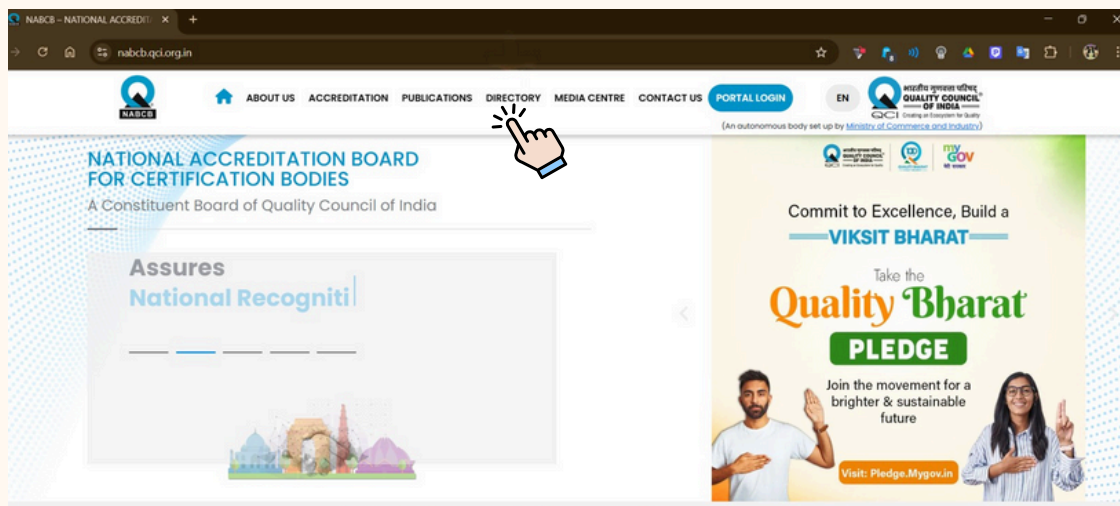
Flow chart of Accreditation Process

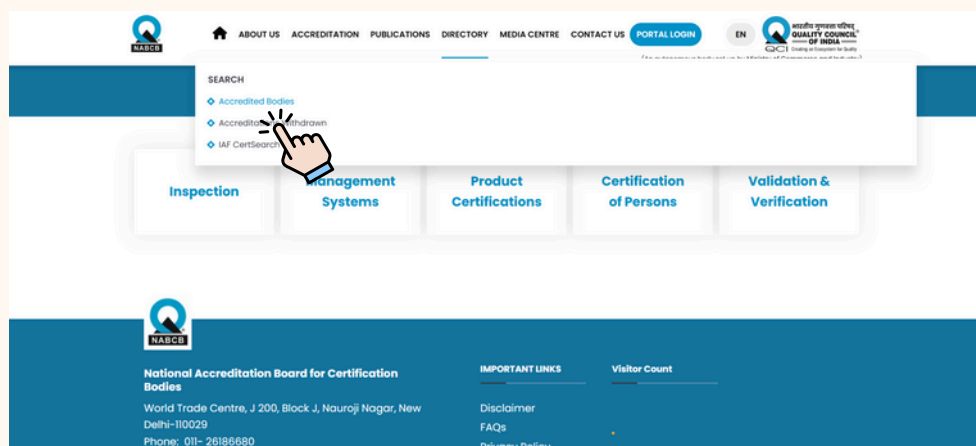

SEARCHING ACCREDITED CAB

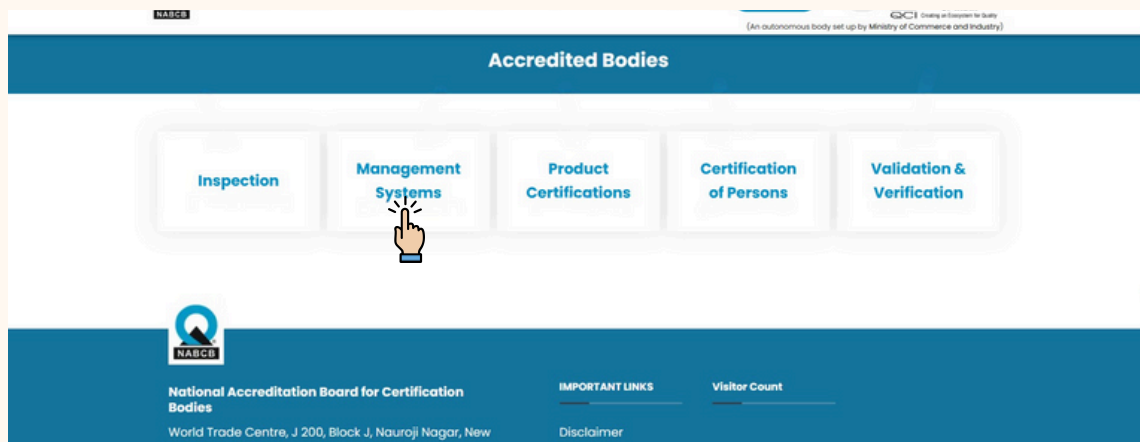

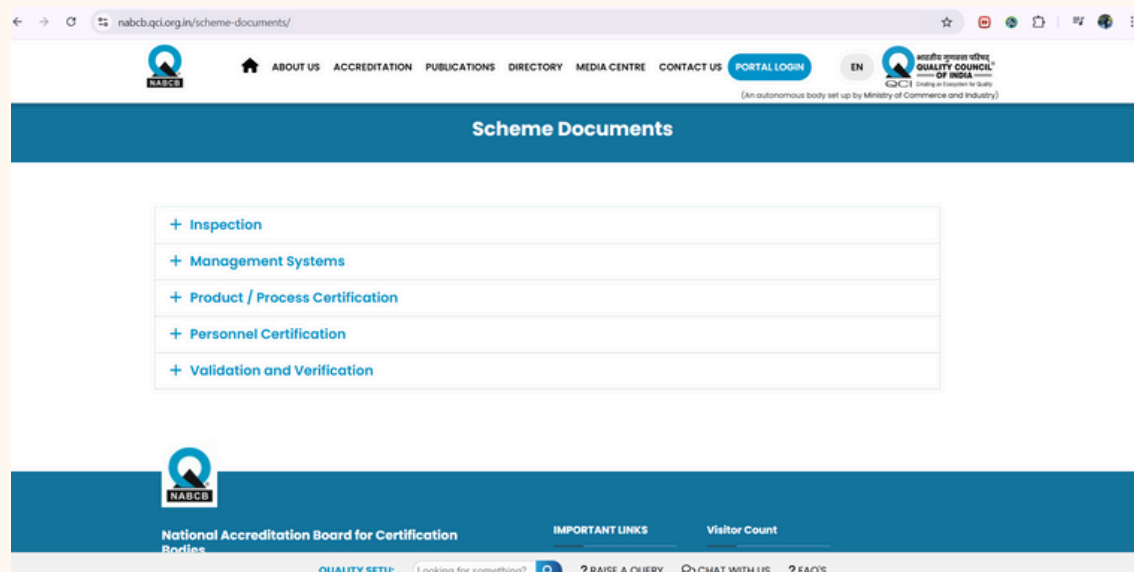

NABCB STAKEHOLDERS' MEET

NABCB convened a Stakeholders' Meeting on 8 December 2025 at Bharat Board Room QCI, bringing together key stakeholders from the conformity assessment ecosystem to discuss developments in accreditation activities, emerging requirements, and stakeholder expectations.

The meeting provided a structured platform for dialogue on accreditation-related matters, including implementation challenges, opportunities for strengthening alignment with national and international accreditation frameworks, and detailed discussions on transition policies for various standards. Inputs and feedback received from stakeholders will support the continual improvement of NABCB processes, transition management, and stakeholder engagement mechanisms.

FSSC 24000 WORKSHOP

Strengthening Competence in Social Sustainability

As part of our continued efforts to strengthen technical competence in emerging social sustainability standards, NABCB officials attended an intensive 3-day training programme on FSSC 24000 at the Goa Institute of Management (GIM).

The workshop offered clarity on how FSSC 24000:2022 focus on labour practices, occupational health and safety, ethical business conduct, social accountability, governance, and continuous improvement through a structured PDCA framework. This learning has strengthened their technical perspective on applying and evaluating social sustainability systems in line with globally recognised certification frameworks and the expectations supported by the National Accreditation Board for Certification Bodies (NABCB).

The programme was facilitated by RRMA in collaboration with Foundation FSSC, with valuable insights shared by experts from Foundation FSSC. The learning experience at GIM further reinforced the practical integration of sustainability principles through institutional practices. This engagement marks a meaningful step toward building informed competence in FSSC 24000 for supporting robust and credible social sustainability certification initiatives.



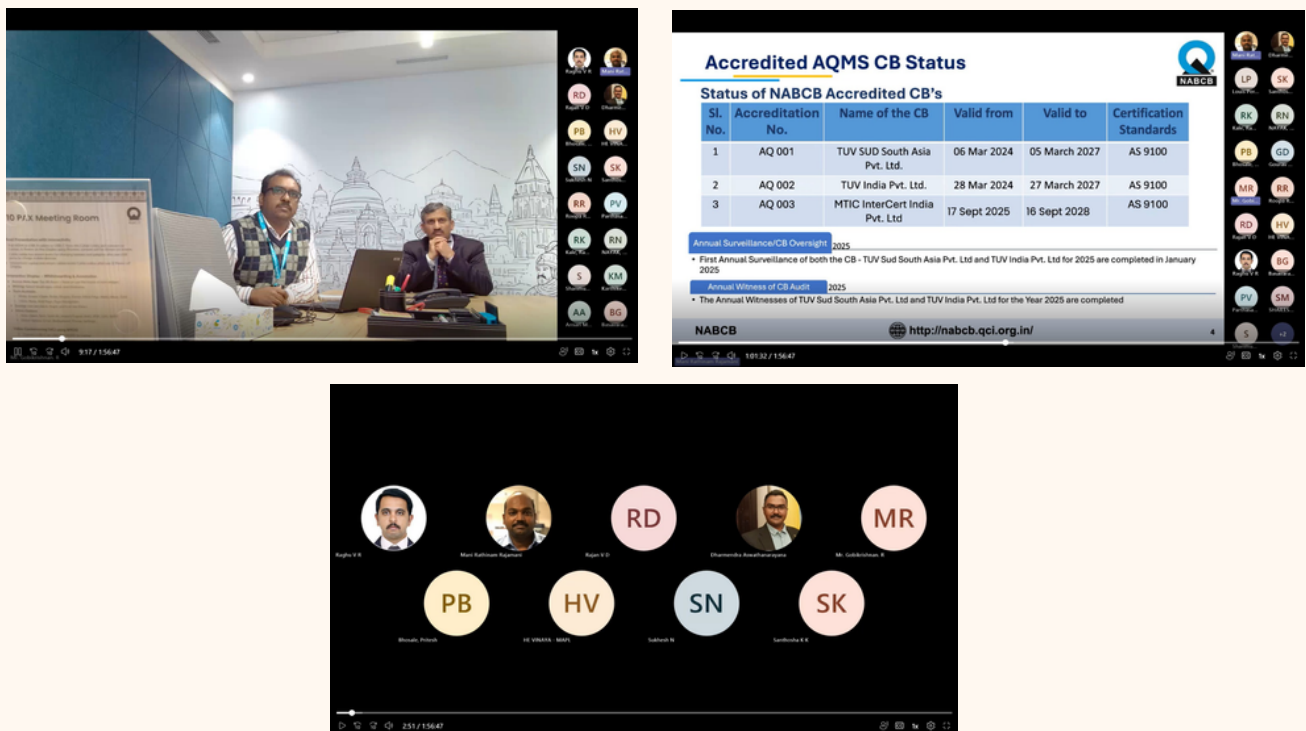

NABCB AT INDIA RMS BOARD MEETING

India RMS Board Meeting | Aerospace Quality Management System

NABCB convened and participated in the India Regional Management Structure (RMS) Board Meeting on 28th November 2025 for the Aerospace Quality Management System (AQMS) to review the status of AQMS-accredited Certification Bodies and to engage stakeholders on key transition-related matters. The meeting brought together representatives from Certification Bodies and members of the India RMS to ensure alignment on current and upcoming AQMS requirements.

Discussions focused on transition planning for forthcoming changes in aerospace standards, implementation of ICOT resolutions, feedback received from stakeholders, and readiness for adoption of the IAQG Artificial Intelligence policy. Challenges faced by Certification Bodies, including issues related to OASIS implementation, were reviewed, with emphasis on clarity, consistency, and coordinated action to support an effective and timely transition.

NABCB at NDE 2025- 35th ANNUAL CONFERENCE & EXHIBITION

Plenary address by CEO, NABCB, highlighting the role of accreditation in strengthening NDE competence and global acceptance

The National Accreditation Board for Certification Bodies (NABCB) participated at the 35th Annual Conference and Exhibition on Non-Destructive Evaluation (NDE 2025), organized by the Indian Society for Non-Destructive Testing (ISNT) held at Jio World Convention, Mumbai from 11-13 December 2025. The engagement focused on highlighting the critical role of accreditation in ensuring technical competence, consistency, and reliability in Non-Destructive Examination across high-risk and safety-critical sectors. NABCB emphasized how internationally aligned accreditation frameworks support regulators, industry, and conformity assessment bodies in building confidence in NDE outcomes.

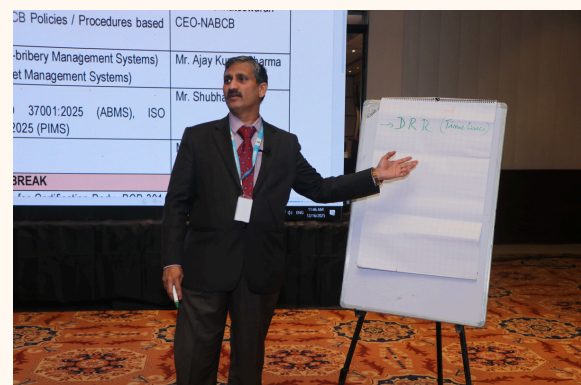
Plenary address by CEO-NABCB at NDE 2025

During the plenary session, the CEO, NABCB, highlighted how NABCB accreditation enables global acceptance of personnel certification and inspection outcomes through alignment with international standards and multilateral recognition arrangements. The address underscored the importance of standardized inspection practices, risk-based evaluation, and competence assurance in enhancing industrial safety, asset reliability, and regulatory compliance, reaffirming NABCB's commitment to supporting industry through credible and internationally aligned accreditation systems.

NABCB ASSESSORS' TECHNICAL MEET

The NABCB Assessors' Technical Meet was held on 16–17 December 2025 in New Delhi, with participation from assessors associated with Certification Bodies (CBs), Inspection Bodies (IBs), and Validation & Verification Bodies (VVBs). The two-day programme was designed to strengthen technical competence, consistency, and ethical rigor in accreditation assessments, in line with evolving national and international accreditation requirements.

The deliberations covered updates from ISO, IAF, ILAC, and APAC, revisions and transition requirements of key international standards, updates to NABCB documents and applicable mandatory international requirements, and the Code of Ethics and professional obligations of NABCB assessors. Case studies on non-conformities, assessment management practices, and open discussions enabled structured technical exchange and experience sharing among assessors and NABCB officials, supporting continual improvement of NABCB accreditation processes under the aegis of the Quality Council of India (QCI).

Key Focus Areas and Outcomes

The meet provided a focused platform for detailed discussions across accreditation functions. Day 1 addressed assessors for Certification Bodies, covering updates on NABCB policies and procedures, revisions to international management system standards, transition policies, ethical requirements, and assessment management skills, along with case-based discussions on non-conformities. Day 2 focused on assessors for Inspection Bodies and Validation & Verification Bodies, including revisions to inspection and validation standards, accreditation criteria, use of accreditation symbols and international marks, emerging schemes, and regulatory developments.

Open deliberations across both days enabled assessors to share field experiences, highlight implementation challenges, and provide feedback for strengthening consistency and effectiveness in assessments. The meet reinforced NABCB's commitment to credibility, transparency, assessor competence, and alignment with global accreditation frameworks, while fostering a collaborative approach to continuous improvement.

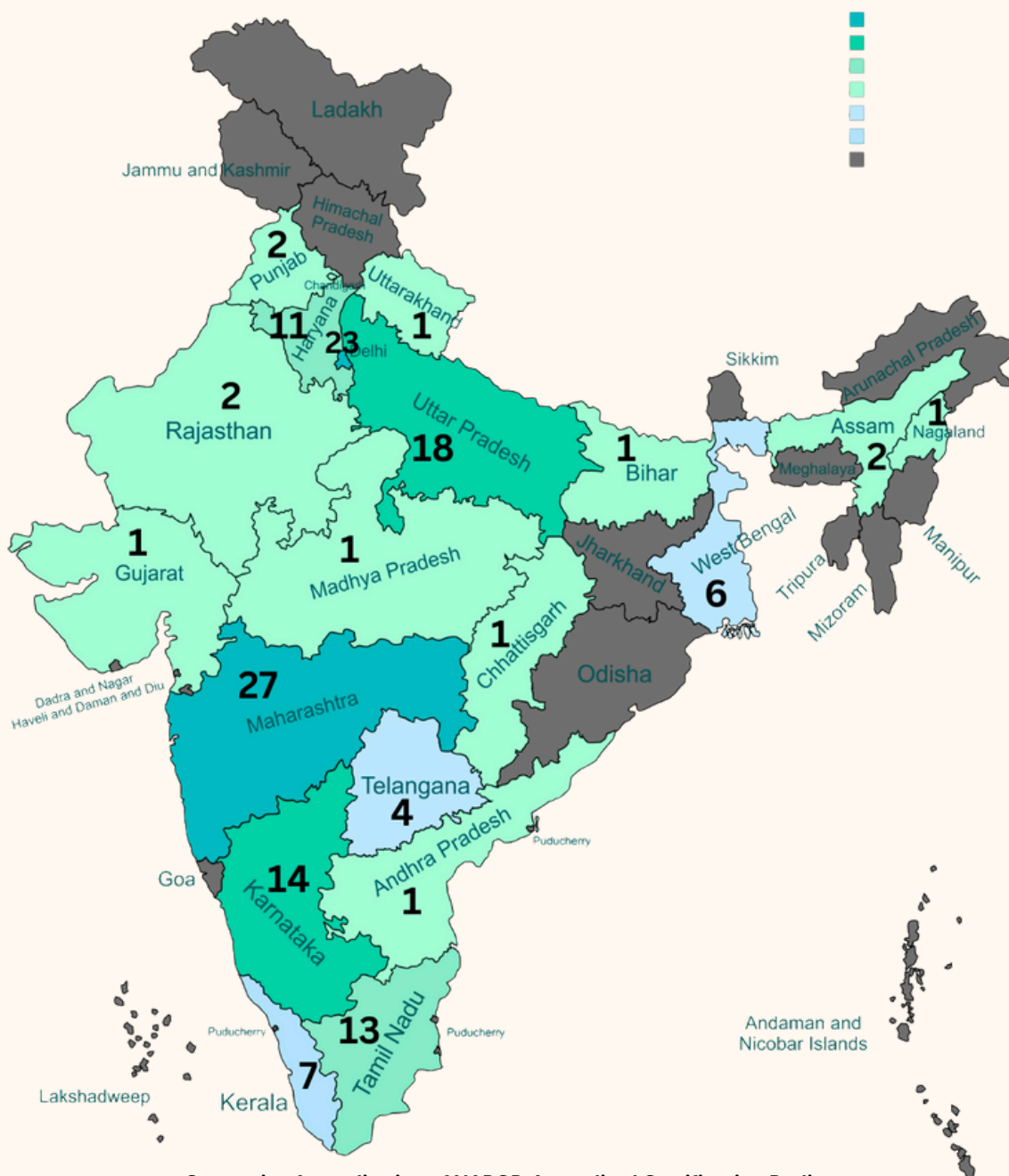

The map below illustrates the nationwide presence of NABCB-Accredited Certification Bodies (CBs) across India.

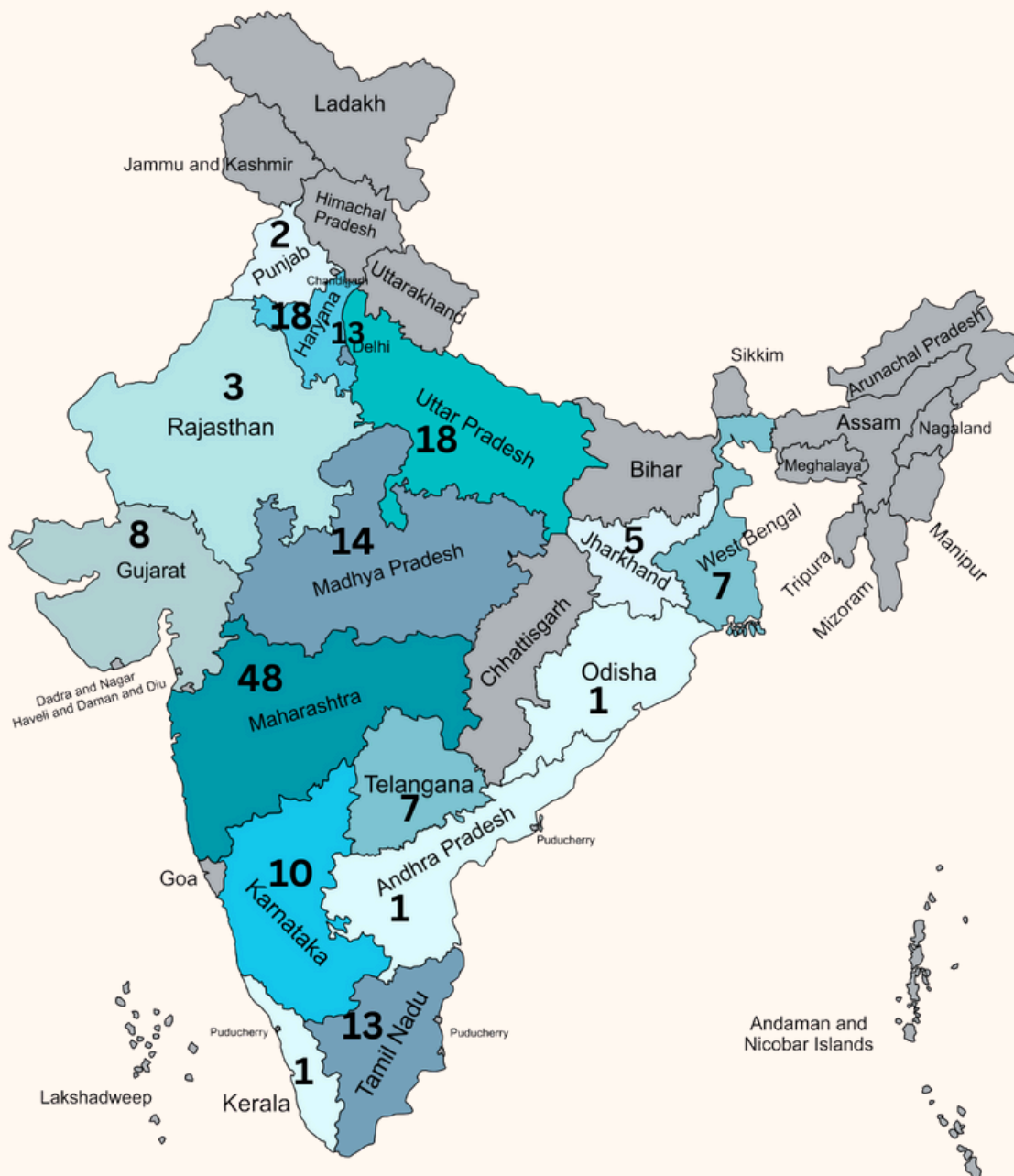


State-wise Accreditation of NABCB-Accredited Certification Bodies

The map below presents the state-wise presence of NABCB-Accredited Inspection Bodies (IBs) across India, highlighting their distribution and operational reach.

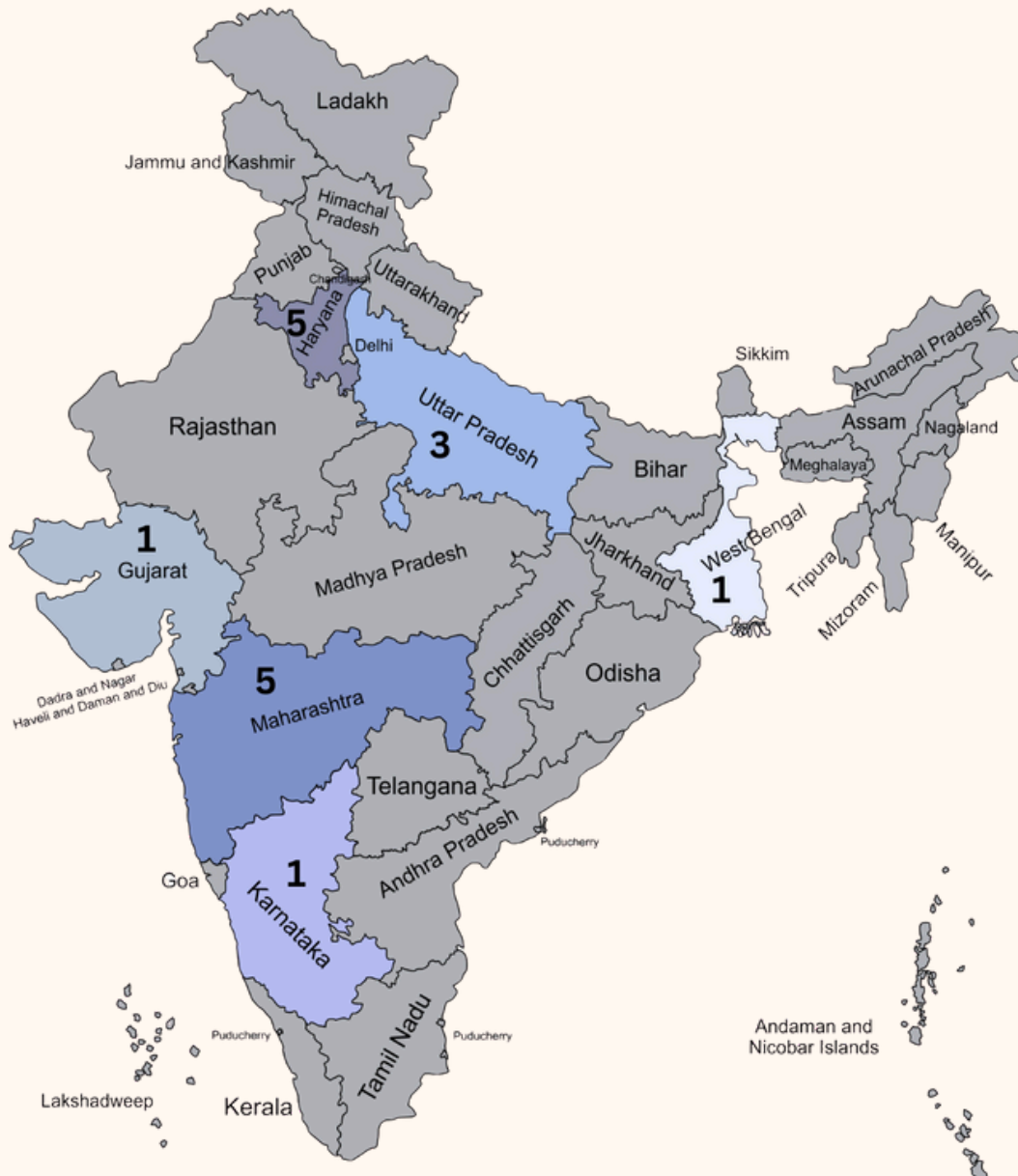


State-wise Accreditation of NABCB-Accredited Inspection Bodies

The map below displays the state-wise presence of NABCB-Accredited Validation and Verification Bodies (VVBs) across India.

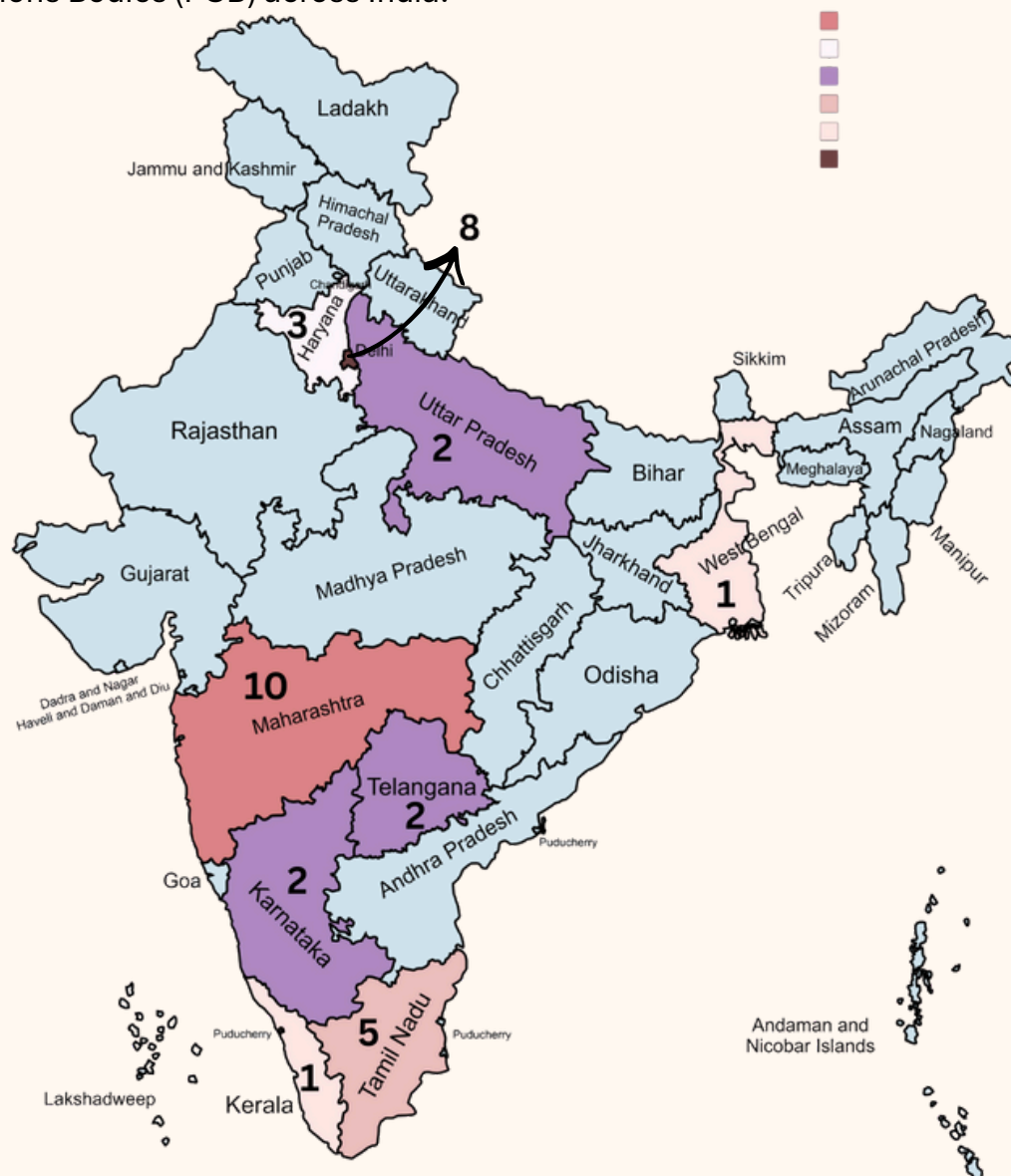


State-wise Accreditation of NABCB-Accredited Validation & Verification Bodies

The map below displays the state-wise presence of NABCB-Accredited Product Certifications Bodies (PCB) across India.

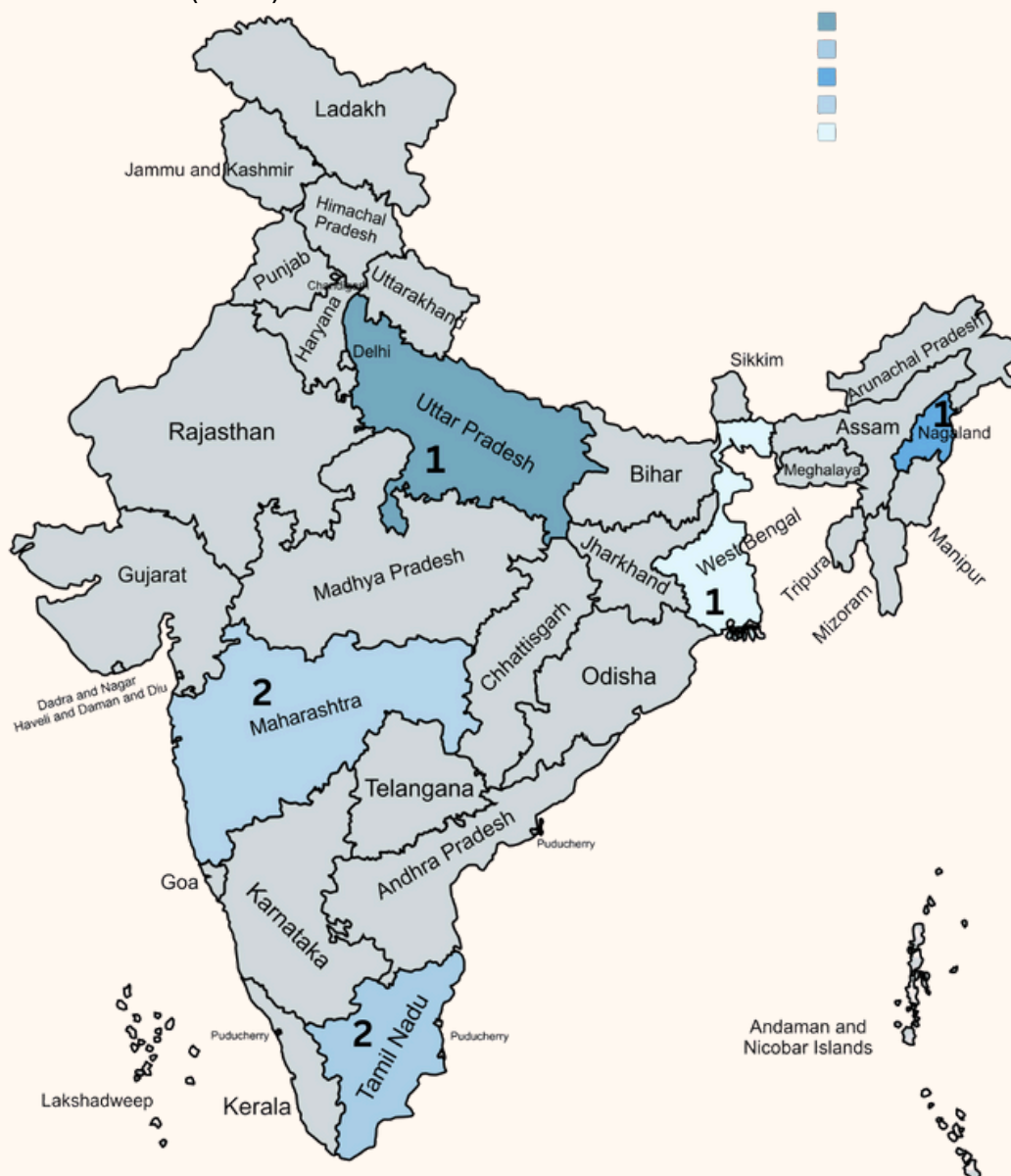

International Featured Standards (IFS)

International Featured Standards (IFS) develops globally recognised product safety and quality standards and programmes for organisations across the food and consumer goods supply chain. The IFS standards and programmes establish structured requirements for assessing suppliers of both private-label and branded products, ensuring the consistent delivery of safe, high-quality products in line with customer and regulatory specifications. IFS certification is operated under the Product Certification Body (PCB) framework in accordance with ISO/IEC 17065:2012, supporting credible, impartial, and internationally accepted product certification. Through this framework, IFS aims to enhance confidence among retailers and consumers that products available on retail shelves meet established safety and quality expectations.

Asset Management System (AMS) | ISO 55001

ISO 55001 is the internationally recognised management system standard for Asset Management Systems (AMS) and forms a key part of the ISO 55000 family of standards. It specifies the requirements for establishing, implementing, maintaining, and continually improving an effective asset management system, enabling organizations to manage physical, financial, human, and intangible assets in a structured and systematic manner.

The standard provides a framework to balance performance, risk, and cost across the asset lifecycle, supporting organizations in achieving strategic and operational objectives in a sustainable way. By adopting ISO 55001, organizations can optimize asset value, enhance decision-making, improve financial and operational performance, and demonstrate reliability and accountability to stakeholders.

ISO 55001 certification is delivered under the Management System certification framework in accordance with ISO/IEC 17021-1:2015, supporting credible and internationally accepted certification for organizations seeking robust asset management practices.
