

NABCB's work directly contributes to enhancing trust in certified products, processes, and services, supporting regulators, industries, and consumers across various sectors. Its accreditation programs align with global best practices, enabling accredited bodies to demonstrate consistent performance and technical competence in the services they deliver.

# GUIDANCE TO USE NABCB ACCREDITATION SYMBOL AND ILAC MRA MARK/ IAF MLA MARK

## BCB 202, Feb 2023 Specifies the Conditions for Use of NABCB Accreditation Symbol and Other Claims of Accreditation, IAF MLA Mark and ILAC MRA Mark

The NABCB Accreditation Symbol represents credibility, competence, and international alignment. It comprises the NABCB symbol along with the unique accreditation number assigned to each accredited Conformity Assessment Body (CAB). The approved design specifications, including proportions, colour schemes, and usage format, are detailed in Appendix A (NABCB Symbol) and Appendix B (combined NABCB–IAF MLA / ILAC MRA Mark).

Accredited CABs, where permitted, may also use the Combined IAF MLA Mark (for certification and validation/verification bodies) or the ILAC MRA Mark (for inspection bodies). Use of these international marks shall comply with IAF ML 2 and ILAC R7 requirements and is subject to a formal agreement with NABCB, ensuring correct representation and alignment with international accreditation frameworks.

Prevention of Misuse	<i>The accredited CAB shall take reasonable actions to prevent misleading, incorrect, or unauthorized use of the NABCB Accreditation Symbol by itself or its client organizations.</i>
Corrective Action	<i>In case of misuse, the accredited CAB shall ensure immediate corrective action, including withdrawal of authorization, where required.</i>
Non-Compliance	<i>Failure to control or prevent misuse of the NABCB Accreditation Symbol may result in corrective action, suspension, or withdrawal of accreditation.</i>

The accredited CAB can reproduce the NABCB Accreditation Symbol and the Combined IAF MLA or ILAC MRA Mark as applicable only in conjunction with its own logo / mark on its certificates, reports, stationery and literature associated with its accredited activities and scopes subject to the conditions specified in BCB-202.

Use of NABCB Accreditation Symbol, IAF MLA Mark, or ILAC MRA Mark on visiting cards is NOT permitted.

### Content, Size and Reproduction of NABCB Accreditation Symbol and IAF MLA Mark or ILAC MRA Mark (As per Clause 5.3.1 of BCB-202)


The NABCB Accreditation Symbol shall be reproduced strictly in accordance with the approved design specifications provided in Appendix A. This includes the prescribed proportions, colour combinations, and overall appearance of the NABCB logo. As a general requirement, the NABCB logo shall not be reduced below a minimum size of 15 × 12 mm, to ensure clear visibility and legibility.

Accredited Conformity Assessment Bodies (CABs) shall reproduce the NABCB Accreditation Symbol along with the correct accreditation number, which shall be displayed below the NABCB logo. The accreditation number is an integral part of the symbol and shall always be shown correctly.

The NABCB Accreditation Symbol shall not be reproduced by client organizations on its own. Any permitted use by a client organization shall be only in conjunction with the logo/mark of the NABCB-accredited CAB and under the control and authorization of the accredited CAB.

The NABCB Accreditation Symbol shall be printed only in the approved colour combinations or in the grey-black version, as specified in the applicable Appendix. No other colour variations or modifications are permitted.

Where applicable, the Combined IAF MLA Mark or ILAC MRA Mark may be used by accredited CABs only under a formal agreement with NABCB. These international marks shall be reproduced and used strictly in accordance with the latest versions of IAF ML 2 and ILAC R7, respectively, and the specific conditions stipulated in the agreement signed with NABCB.

**Action on Suspension or Withdrawal**


Upon suspension or withdrawal of accreditation, the accredited CAB shall immediately discontinue the use of the NABCB Accreditation Symbol, IAF MLA Mark, and ILAC MRA Mark on all certificates, stationery, and publicity material. Use may resume only after suspension is formally revoked.

# ACCREDITATION PROCESS

The NABCB accreditation process follows a structured, multi-stage evaluation framework designed to ensure that Conformity Assessment Bodies (CABs) operate competently, consistently, and impartially. The sequence of activities—from application to accreditation decision—ensures that each CAB is rigorously assessed before approval and continuously monitored throughout the Accreditation cycle.








The map below illustrates the nationwide presence of NABCB-Accredited Certification Bodies (CBs) across India.

## Geographical Presence of NABCB-Accredited Inspection Bodies


The map below presents the state-wise presence of NABCB-Accredited Inspection Bodies (IBs) across India, highlighting their distribution and operational reach.

## Geographical Presence of NABCB-Accredited Validation & Verification Bodies (VVBs)


The map below displays the state-wise presence of NABCB-Accredited Validation and Verification Bodies (VVBs) across India.

## Geographical Presence of NABCB-Accredited Product Certification Bodies (PCB)


The map below displays the state-wise presence of NABCB-Accredited Product Certification Bodies (PCB) across India.

The map below displays the state-wise presence of NABCB-Accredited Personnel Certification Bodies (PrCB) across India.





# SCHEME IN SPOTLIGHT: KEY ACCREDITATION OPPORTUNITIES

## Validation & Verification Bodies ISO 17029:2019

ISO/IEC 17029:2019 establishes the global benchmark for competence, impartiality, and consistent operation of validation and verification bodies.

Under this framework, NABCB enables credible assurance across climate action, carbon markets, and sustainability mechanisms.



## 1. Greenhouse Gases

Accreditation under ISO/IEC 17029 in conjunction with ISO 14065 strengthens the credibility of GHG validation and verification activities.

It ensures robust assessment of emissions reporting, climate mitigation projects, and organizational carbon inventories aligned with international climate commitments.

## 2. ICAO CORSIA

The Carbon Offsetting and Reduction Scheme for International Aviation (CORSIA) operates under the International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO) framework.

Accreditation as per ISO/IEC 17029 ensures aviation emissions are independently verified with integrity, supporting global aviation decarbonization goals and market-based offset mechanisms.

### 3. Verified Carbon Standard (VCS)

The Verified Carbon Standard drives high-integrity carbon credit generation worldwide. Through ISO/IEC 17029-based accreditation, NABCB ensures competent validation and verification of emission reduction projects, enhancing trust in voluntary carbon markets. 
### 4. Carbon Credit Trading Scheme (CCTS)
